# Chairperson's Report / Actions from previous meeting:

- YLCA Hambleton meeting 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2016 report
  - Meeting attended by JB
  - New "highways portal" for reporting via the Internet issues such as potholes and overgrown grass ink place
  - o Fracking planning to be a topic of the next YCLA meeting
- Local Plan Meeting 19<sup>TH</sup> July 2016 report
  - Meeting attended by JB

## Purpose of meeting:

Input into site assessments from members of community to gather local intelligence of the sites within Parish/Village boundaries

There have been **no decisions** made on any sites in any community (although some sites have planning applications submitted - not ours).

There are about 500 sites across Hambleton that have been put forward for consideration which need to be assessed against criteria including environmental, historic, highway, infrastructure etc.

The Local Plan has the following timeline:

Preferred options - September 2016 submitted to Secretary of State (Planning Inspectors)

Public consultations - 2017

Final Adoption - 2018

There are 2 areas indicated in Carlton Husthwaite (see attached):

- T/024/001 Housing 1.16 Hectares (25 to 30 houses per hectare)
- Location: Croft Lane
- T/024/002/G Local Green Space
- Location: Area surrounding Village Hall
- JB raised issues with respect to a large scale housing development such as being wishing a Conservation area, lack of facilities etc.


The following statements were left them with a plan of our amenities and constraints:

- Single track roads with heavy farming machinery
- Limited footpaths on Croft Lane
- No bus or shops
- Amenities: pub, church, post box, telephone box (no phone!)
- Speed issues
- Views impacted
- Current use is agricultural

Full infrastructure issues will be investigated further as part of the next steps. We may need to speak to Hambleton DC Planning Dept. as it has been indicated (following discussions with HDC) that there was no provision for any further development in this village as we do not have the infrastructure.

### Identified from the map:

- There is a surface water issue Lilac / Purple area next to the RED hatched area on Croft Lane
- There is a historic England perimeter that intersects the site (the Hatched Circles) so must have "Historic England" permission.



- Neighbourhood watch discussions with JB
  - JB met with John Butler and was satisfied with the discussion that good surveillance of the Village is in place.
  - o Anne Harrison is still supporting J Butler with any email correspondence
  - Anne Harrison has now collected the new info Neighbourhood watch booklet and window stickers for the Committee to deliver.
  - o JB informs that Inspector David Murray is our support officer
- Centenary Fields update

- Planning & Levy meeting -2<sup>nd</sup> session?

- Cedar's update
  - Still with Hambleton Planning
- Village Boundary & Footpaths update

- Caroline Patmore introduction update

- Pot Holes update
  - Council advise that a pot hole is defined by a depth of 45mm
- Speed gun Update
  - Coxwold have invested in a gun
  - o JB to see if they are willing to share this facility
  - o JB to review signage with the Police
- Litter Signs & Bin update
  - o To Do
- Salt bin update
  - Establish our classification for gritting priority
  - o Salt bin £50 cost plus £75 twice yearly top up agreed to invest, subject to location
  - Review location at Croft Lane crossroads proposed
- Defibrillator access
  - The question of access was raised when a resident had a recent need to use and struggled with access
  - There is a code required to access the unit, however, this should have been given to the resident by the emergency services and wasn't.
    - Add a note in the CH Info pack about this
    - And add to the CH website (KH)
  - As a backup, Local access codes are known by Hilary Bell, Christine Spalding and Jason Sargent.

  - Cost is £177 per year

  - Also, play tower to be considered

  - o However, that is a struggle

    - The Photo contest Bing run by Daphne Smith
    - The 200 club
      - Check this is being re-issued to all villagers SL
    - Tractor run?
  - o Or it will close.
